

## Information for Cluster Day #4 – Wednesday 19 July

### Updated Information

Following on from the Cluster Day earlier this term, please see below updated information;

- Please ensure that if your child has any medical conditions, that they bring their required medication e.g. child with asthma requires their puffer and spacer, child with anaphylaxis requires their epi-pen.
- The changes to venues from Cluster Day 2 are now current for the remaining Cluster Days – see below;
  - Year 9/10 Basketball Boys – Gold Coast Sports & Leisure Centre
  - Year 11/12 Basketball Boys – Runaway Bay Indoor Centre.
- Additional changes to venues starting from Cluster Day 4 are as per below;
  - Table Tennis – Robina State High School (Cluster Day 4 only)
  - Year 7-12 Basketball Girls - Gold Coast Sports & Leisure Centre (for the remainder of Cluster Days)
- A reminder that it is compulsory for all students to wear their white sports shirt with sports pants and dedicated sports shoes (as per the Benowa SHS Uniform Policy). It is also compulsory for all students to bring a hat.
- Students must have submitted their *2023 Carnival, HPE & Inter-School Sport Events Participation & Transport Consent Confirmation* to participate. ### What is the process for a Cluster Day?

As per a normal school day, students will arrive at school in their full sports uniform (white shirt) and attend Care Class. Following Care Class, students will meet at designated areas for their activity. This information will be distributed prior to the day via their Care Class teachers, Compass and on sports noticeboards. ## What does my child need to bring?

Students are to have a school hat, lunch and a water bottle for the duration of the day. Sunscreen is also recommended. In addition, specialised equipment may be necessary to adhere to safety requirements for some activities – please see the list below.

Activity	Specialised Equipment Required (provided by parents/guardians)
<b>Gold Coast 6 (GC6) Sports</b>	
<b>Basketball</b>	A minimum dedicated sport shoe as per the Benowa SHS uniform policy (non-slip soles, no buckles or zips and no sharp-edged soles).
<b>Chess</b>	No specific equipment required for this sport.
<b>Futsal</b>	A minimum dedicated sport shoe as per the Benowa SHS uniform policy (non-slip soles, no buckles or zips, no loose, sharp-edged or excessively worn studs and no sharp-edged soles). Moulded boots can be worn - <b>no screw in studded footwear</b> . Shin pads are compulsory - must be correctly sized and fastened shin guards, covered entirely by long socks.
<b>Lawn Bowls</b>	A minimum dedicated sport shoe as per the Benowa SHS uniform policy (flat soled shoes).
<b>Netball</b>	A minimum dedicated sport shoe as per the Benowa SHS uniform policy (non-slip soles, no buckles or zips and no sharp-edged soles).
<b>Soccer</b>	A minimum dedicated sport shoe as per the Benowa SHS uniform policy (non-slip soles, no buckles or zips, no loose, sharp-edged or excessively worn studs and no sharp-edged soles). Moulded boots can be worn - no screw in studded footwear. Shin pads are compulsory - must be correctly sized and fastened shin guards, covered entirely by long socks.
<b>Table Tennis</b>	A minimum dedicated sport shoe as per the Benowa SHS uniform policy - shoes must have NON-MARKING soles (i.e., no black soled shoes).
<b>Ten Pin Bowling</b>	A minimum dedicated sport shoe as per the Benowa SHS uniform policy - shoes must have NON-MARKING soles (i.e., no black soled shoes).

<b>Touch Football</b>	A minimum dedicated sport shoe as per the Benowa SHS uniform policy (non-slip soles, no buckles or zips and no screw-in studs and no sharp-edged soles). Touch boots are optional.
<b>Volleyball</b>	A minimum dedicated sport shoe as per the Benowa SHS uniform policy (non-slip soles, no buckles or zips and no sharp-edged soles). Knee pads are required.
<b>Other Activities</b>	
<b>Certificate II Courses – Community Services, Visual Arts &amp; Photography, Hospitality</b>	Laptop required including charger. <b>Dance Extension</b>	Dance appropriate clothing for rehearsals. Cost includes costume hire, Eisteddfod fees and Dance Extension T-shirt.
<b>Dramafest</b>	Cost includes rights to plays, production costs, some costuming and props, make up and a cast T-shirt.
<b>Drone Course</b>	No specific equipment required.
<b>Learn or Earn</b>	-
<b>Redbacks Volleyball</b>	A minimum dedicated sport shoe as per the Benowa SHS uniform policy. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• non-slip soles, no buckles or zips and no sharp-edged soles.</li> <li>• A whistle and knee pads are required.</li> <li>• Laptops with chargers will be required for classroom activities during training days.</li> </ul>
<b>School Program</b>	A minimum dedicated sport shoe as per the Benowa SHS uniform policy.
<b>School Program with Ice Skating (Half Day)</b>	A minimum dedicated sport shoe as per the Benowa SHS uniform policy. For ice skating, long socks, protective clothing to prevent ice grazes and wrist guards are required. Optional additional protective equipment to consider are elbow, knee, wrist guards and/or helmet.
<b>Study Day</b>	Laptop required including charger. Students should bring their school work or assessment work to ensure the day is productive.

## Is there any insurance cover?

Some school activities and physical education, particularly contact sports, carry inherent risks of injury. Parents are advised that the department does not have Student Accident Insurance cover for students.

If your child is injured at school as a result of an accident or incident, all costs associated with the injury, including medical costs, are the responsibility of the child, parent or caregiver. Some incidental medical costs may be covered by Medicare. If parents have private health insurance, some costs may also be covered through the private health insurance. Any other costs would be borne by the parents.

Student Accident Insurance is an insurance policy that pays certain benefits in certain circumstances should your child have an accident. It is a personal decision for parents as to the types and levels of private insurance they arrange to cover their child for any accidental injury that may occur.

Parents should contact their insurer or an approved Australian insurance broker for more information about student personal accident insurance cover for their child.
