**Under this agreement for 2017
Benowa State High School will receive**

\$661,407*

This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of students meeting NAPLAN minimum standard in Year 9 Reading to 98% and upper two bands to 25%. Targets for 2018 will be national decile 8+.
- Increase the percentage of students meeting NAPLAN minimum standard in Year 9 Numeracy from to 99% and upper two bands to 30%. Targets for 2018 will be national decile 8+.
- Increase U2B Writing to 25% (Yr 7) and 20% (Yr 9).
- Focus on curriculum provisions for high potential learners in Senior Secondary (IB)
- Focus QCS preparation on the goals of OP 1-5 to (30%) and OP 1-15 (95%).

Our initiatives include

- Using Diagnostic Tools (with a NAPLAN and QCS focus) to identify learning gaps.
- Implementing intervention action plans (including Eagle and Wolf, Collins Writing Program and SIM).
- Sourcing Teacher Professional Development.
- Staffing 'Lead Teachers' for Reading, Writing, Numeracy, Direct Instruction (1.5) and Accreditation.
- Providing school tutorial programs for Junior Secondary and Senior Secondary students.
- Implementing student well-being initiatives.
- Providing a curriculum development, resourcing and implementation focus for high potential learners in senior secondary.

Staff Lead Teacher Roles in Reading, Writing, Numeracy, Direct Instruction and Accreditation	\$318,463
Implementing student well-being initiatives including a model of transitional coaching	\$65,000
Resourcing Curriculum and teacher professional development for high potential learners in senior secondary	\$90,000
